Use of Waste Management Facilities in the Coolamon Shire

1. Ensure that all waste products are sorted prior to taking them to waste recycling facilities. If mixed waste is taken to sites, you may be asked to separate accordingly or charged the appropriate rate.


2. Where possible it would be appreciated if household domestic waste be deposited into the landfill hole in bags or wrapped where possible, Council endeavours to keep all our sites and neighbouring properties free from airborne waste.

3. Kerbside 'wastebin' pick up has increased amount of waste not bagged, this makes it both extremely difficult to get all waste into the truck (especially in windy conditions) as well as issues at the landfill sites, All waste must be bagged prior to entering in the bin.
